

John is an active third-generation rancher west of Calgary on his Val Vista Ranch at Springbank with his wife Katrina, his family and staff. John has always been interested in the outdoors, animals, wildlife, fish, and especially gamebirds.



### DONATIONS FOR 2024 Extended to February 28, 2025








### SAVE THE EDGES RECEIVES BUDGET APPROVAL!

Pheasants Forever Calgary's Managing Director Perry McCormick believes, "The Save the Edges campaign which launched in 2019 has helped bring awareness to the issue of trespass farming. But, there's still more we can do and it's a priority for us." To that end, Pheasants Forever Calgary has approved expenditures to continue the campaign into 2025.

Farmers and municipalities are starting to understand the benefits of edges on their properties and we want to continue building on that. We will roll out another round of awareness communications in print and radio, as well as continue to do county visits where ever possible. The goal is to continue to encourage keeping public roadside ditches and right-of-ways intact. For years these edges have provided some of the last vestiges of habitat for upland game birds and remain a priority concern for the organization.

Natural non-cropped areas, specifically in roadside ditches and undeveloped right-of-ways provide a broad suite of societal benefits and we're excited about being able to continue to spread the word.

## Doug Ramsay Joins the Board of Directors

Doug Ramsay, born in Edmonton, before the tender age of 7 had lived in various towns throughout Alberta before settling back in Brooks. Doug began his career working on drilling and work

over rigs throughout Alberta and Saskatchewan. He first went to work in the pressure pumping business for BJ Well Services in 1973. He returned to school to earn his Petroleum Engineering Technology Diploma from SAIT Polytechnic. He later received the designation of Registered Engineering Technologist from ASET.

Upon graduation from SAIT, Doug went to work for Dome Petroleum as a Drilling and Completions Foreman. Doug then joined Delta Consultants as a consulting engineer, where he was responsible for drilling, completions and production operations for a number of oil & gas companies. In 1981 at 26 years old, Doug joined Eagle Exploration as Manager of Drilling & Completion Operations from the Wichita, Kansas office where he handled drilling, completions and production operations in Kansas, Oklahoma and Texas. In addition, he

was responsible for the management of the company-owned drilling rig.

Doug joined American Fracmaster in Oklahoma where he held various sales and operations responsibilities transferring back to Canada in a Sales Manager role. He rose through the ranks to be appointed President in 1992 responsible for the company's business at that time in Canada and Russia.

After a brief hiatus in the mid-1990s when Doug built his family ranching and real estate business, Doug joined forces with Ron Mathison, Gordon Dibb and Robbie Roberts in 1999 to transform several distressed oilfield service firms to form Calfrac. Calfrac grew from a humble start up to a world class pressure pumping company with operations in 6 countries, sales of over \$2.5 billion and excess of 4,500 employees. Doug handed over the reigns as the CEO in January of 2013 to Fernando Aguilar – a seasoned service company professional. Doug now serves as the Vice Chairman of the corporation.

Doug and his wife, Susan, have not forgotten what is important to them and community with major contributions to STARS, by forming the Susan Ramsay Advanced Skills Institute and to SAIT, the Ramsay Centre for Petroleum Engineering. Most recently Doug and Susan made a major contribution to Foothills Country Hospice focused on the expansion of the facility to better service people in their last days.

Doug is a long-time supporter of Pheasants Forever, and chaired the 20th Annual Dinner & Auction in 2013. We are very pleased to have Doug on our Board of Directors.

#### Farewell and Thank You Bill Friley

After 10 years of holding the position as Director for Pheasants Forever Calgary, Bill Friley has decided to step down from the Board. Bill first chaired the 12th Annual Dinner & Auction in 2005. The dinner had 669 attendees, which is still the largest dinner Pheasants Forever has ever held in Canada in 30 years.

Bill founded Triumph Energy Corp. in 1993, where he held the title of Chairman, President & Chief Executive Officer until 2001. Currently, he is the President & Chief Executive Officer of Telluride Oil & Gas Ltd., Skyeland Oils Ltd., and a Director of Advanced Flow Technology Co., Advanced Flow Technologies, Inc., and Titan Energy Services Ltd.

In the past, he served as Chairman of TimberRock Energy Corp., Canadian Association of Petroleum Producers, and Osum Oil Sands Corp.

He was also a Director of Viking Energy Royalty Trust, Mustang Resources, Inc., Harvest Energy Trust, Harvest Operations Corp., Silverstar Well Servicing Ltd., and Vice President-Alberta Region of The Nature Conservancy of Canada.

Bill's longtime leadership and generosity will be missed.

## MARGINAL AREAS PROGRAM UPDATE

Information provided by Graydon Garner, Ducks Unlimited Canada



As of this printing the Marginal Areas Program (MAP) in partnership with Ducks Unlimited Canada (DUC) is in the process of finalizing enrollment with 34 producers for 2024. This will result in a total of 1,530 acres converted to perennial cover. Another 277 acres of wetlands and 848 acres of native uplands have also been retained in conjunction with MAP agreements. These are habitats that will stay intact for duration of the 10-year agreement.

2024 was a much more favorable year for establishing forage stands as the spring was cool and moist rather than hot and dry like the previous few years. Seeding went well with few delays and good soil moisture, giving producers ample time to get their forage crops in after their annual grains/oilseeds.

Soil salinity, which is when moisture evaporates from the soil and salt from the water in the soil crystallizes on the surface, continues to be an issue that many farmers are battling with the help of MAP.

The other leading concern is increasing acres of Kochia, a weed that thrives in dry saline soil and has herbicide resistance making it a tough competition to a crop. Combating salinity and Kochia are 2 main reasons that producers are enrolling in the program. Producers are also saying that marginal crop acres don't pay their way anymore as input costs continue to rise.

Record calf prices in 2023 and 2024 left most cattle producers with an empty stockyard, so the price of forage has become a factor in establishing small hay fields as well. We saw some farmers seed marginal cropland to a forage stand and within 2 years go from losing \$400/acre (canola) to making \$200/acre by selling the hay.

MAP is starting to sell itself, it's just a matter of getting the word out to as many producers as possible and maintaining the trust and communication that we have built.

As a partner of MAP in Alberta, Pheasants Forever Canada (PFC) helps DUC provide farmers with a financial solution to areas of unproductive land. MAP offers an incentive of \$125/acre to producers who plant perennial cover in marginal areas of annual cropland. Pheasants Forever Canada provides a \$25/acre top-up to this payment.

#### **MAP - PRODUCER HIGHLIGHT**

One of the stand out projects from 2024 was with a producer who decided to seed 34 dryland corners to perennial forage. Dryland corners are known for lower production, higher weed pressure, greater soil compaction, and less drought tolerance compared to the irrigated portions of the field.

This producer partner was able to realize the benefits that come with establishing perennial forages in marginal areas alongside their annual cash crops. It's important that Alberta farmers make a living on their land. MAP is a great tool for finding harmony between sustainable agricultural production and conservation.

Seeding perennial forages in marginal areas such as dryland corners increases the producers bottom line by:

- Reducing annual crop input costs associated with annual cash crops.
- Increasing plant competition with weeds, eventually choking them out.
- Increase soil cover to reduce topsoil erosion.
- Using moisture during shoulder seasons and reducing surface runoff.
- Providing habitat for beneficial crop insects such as pollinators.
- Providing a buffer zone from neighboring fields.
- Provide an annual source of income through hay or grazing.

The established forage stands also provide on-farm conservation value through:

- Increased dense cover for upland birds.
- · Nesting habitat for waterfowl.
- Winter food sources for ungulates and upland game birds.
- Expanded travel corridors along fence lines and field edges.
- Increased landscape connectivity between isolated habitat patches.

#### What is MAP?

MAP provides a financial solution to unproductive land within annual cropped fields by seeding perennial forages. Program participants can graze, hay, mow, or leave idle.

Pheasants Forever Canada's investment in MAP helps boost the incentive to producers and expands awareness of the organization and our <u>Save the Edges</u> campaign.
